







## **Year 12 LONG-TERM SEQUENCE for Law**



The curriculum for this stage of students' education has been designed to introduce students to legal terminology and how the legal system in the UK works. The content of the specification has been followed to ensure that students have the required knowledge base whilst introducing the concept and skill of applying the law to situations. Whilst this is likely students' first study of the subject, this unit has links to the Key Stage PSHME curriculum, specifically Crime and Justice, and also the issues or morality studied in RE and English. Having completed this unit, students will have a sound understanding of how the legal system in the UK works and this will link to their study of the other 3 units comprising the course where legislation is applied. Students are encouraged to support their learning with regular reviews of legal rulings.
